A folk musician from North Carolina, Joe combines mountain dulcimer wizardry with good, solid vocals. He is a songwriter and vocalist, inspired by artists like Simon & Garfunkel, Gordon Lightfoot, Bob Dylan, and Kris Kristofferson. Joe won the National Mountain Dulcimer Championship in 2007 in Winfield, KS. Over the past twenty years, he has had the opportunity to teach and play in festivals from California to the east coast, from Florida to Vermont. Joe's credits include 13 instructional books and numerous recordings. Professionally, Joe has spent most of his career in Religious Education. He is a graduate from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity with Religious Education, and from NC State University with a Doctorate in Adult Education. Now retired, Joe plans to spend more time with dulcimer, writing music, and traveling to work with clubs and in festivals. Joe's dulcimer tablature arrangements are creative and well-written; he is an entertaining performer.
